## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in school health services, providing 5 for mental health awareness for student athletes, parents, quardians and coaches. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 11 12 section to read: 13 Section 1426. Mental Health Awareness for Student Athletes, Parents, Guardians and Coaches. -- (a) The following apply to 14 15 educational materials: 16 (1) The department and the Department of Education shall 17 develop and post on their publicly accessible Internet websites 18 guidelines and other relevant materials to inform and educate 19 students participating in or desiring to participate in an

athletic activity, their parents or quardians and their coaches

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- 1 about the nature and warning signs of mental health distress,
- 2 mental health illness and related issues.
- 3 (2) In developing the guidelines and materials described
- 4 under clause (1), the department and the Department of Education
- 5 <u>may utilize existing materials developed by mental health</u>
- 6 organizations.
- 7 (3) A student participating in or desiring to participate in
- 8 an athletic activity and the student's parent or quardian shall,
- 9 <u>each school year and prior to participation by the student in an</u>
- 10 athletic activity, sign and return to the student's school an
- 11 <u>acknowledgment of receipt and review of the information sheet</u>
- 12 <u>developed under this subsection regarding the nature and warning</u>
- 13 signs of mental health distress, mental health illness and
- 14 <u>related issues. The information sheet shall also include</u>
- 15 <u>resources available to the student athletes, parents, guardians</u>
- 16 and coaches regarding mental health distress, mental health
- 17 illness and related issues.
- 18 (b) A school entity may hold an informational meeting prior
- 19 to the start of each athletic season for all ages of competitors
- 20 regarding mental health awareness and the nature and warning
- 21 signs of mental health distress, mental health illness and
- 22 related issues. The informational meeting may include students,
- 23 parents, quardians, coaches and other school officials, athletic
- 24 trainers and health care professionals, including physicians,
- 25 psychiatrists, psychologists, nurses, counselors and other
- 26 mental health professionals.
- 27 <u>(c) The following apply to training courses:</u>
- 28 (1) Once each school year, a coach of an athletic activity
- 29 shall complete a mental health awareness training course offered
- 30 by a provider approved by the department.

- 1 (2) A coach of an athletic activity may not coach the
- 2 athletic activity until the coach completes the training course
- 3 <u>required under this subsection.</u>
- 4 (d) The governing body of a school entity shall establish
- 5 the following minimum penalties for a coach found in violation
- 6 of the requirements under subsection (c), which penalties shall
- 7 take effect two years following the effective date of this
- 8 subsection:
- 9 (1) For a first violation, suspension from coaching any
- 10 athletic activity for the remainder of the season.
- 11 (2) For a second violation, suspension from coaching any
- 12 athletic activity for the remainder of the season and for the
- 13 <u>next season.</u>
- 14 (3) For a third violation, permanent suspension from
- 15 coaching any athletic activity.
- 16 (e) The sponsors of youth athletic activities not associated
- 17 with a school entity are encouraged to follow the guidance
- 18 stated in this section.
- 19 (f) Nothing in this section shall be construed to:
- 20 (1) abridge or limit any rights provided under a collective
- 21 bargaining agreement in effect on the effective date of this
- 22 subsection or any rights provided under the act of July 23, 1970
- 23 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the "Public Employe Relations Act";
- 24 <u>or</u>
- 25 (2) create, establish, expand, reduce, contract or eliminate
- 26 any civil liability on the part of a school entity or school
- 27 <u>employe</u>.
- 28 (g) As used in this section--
- 29 "Athletic activity" means all of the following:
- 30 (1) Interscholastic athletics.

- 1 (2) An athletic contest or competition, other than
- 2 interscholastic athletics, that is sponsored by or associated
- 3 with a school entity, including cheerleading, club-sponsored
- 4 sports activities and sports activities sponsored by school-
- 5 <u>affiliated organizations</u>.
- 6 (3) Noncompetitive cheerleading that is sponsored by or
- 7 <u>associated with a school entity.</u>
- 8 (4) Practices, interschool practices and scrimmages for all
- 9 of the activities listed under clauses (1), (2) and (3).
- "Department" means the Department of Health of the
- 11 Commonwealth.
- 12 "Interscholastic athletics" means as defined in section 1602-
- 13 <u>A.</u>
- "School entity" means as defined in section 1602-A.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
